CALL TO ORDER

The Meeting was called to order at 10: 27 hours.

Prior to the commencement of the Meeting, National Anthem was sang followed by a prayer given by Mr. Beenzu Chijokota, the Ward Development Committee Chairperson for Kalama Ward.

OPENING REMARKS

The Assistant Public Relations Officer welcomed everyone present. She highlighted the flow of the program and said that members were invited to that Meeting for the purpose of the 2026 budget consultation which was by law a requirement that such Meetings were to be held once every year to enable the stakeholders and Community submit projects they intended to be undertaken in various areas.

The Assistant Public Relations Officer reminded members that the Ward Development Committee should improve on communication, because they were the link between the Community and Government.

She said that, the Integrated Development Plan was formulated by the people of Mazabuka through their representations and it was a five years plan to guide on projects to be undertaken.

The Director of Finance guided that, members should submit projects including those they submitted previous years as long as they were not implemented. He further said that the approval of projects was done in phases and in priorities and it was not a must that every submitted project would take off as it depended on availability of funds.

Mr. Saul Mwiinga, the Councillor for Ngwezi Ward also encouraged members that they were representatives of the people who knew all the problems faced by the different sectors in their respective communities and should take that opportunity to submit projects that would help people they represented.

SUBMISSION OF INCOME

The Assistant Public Relations Manager further requested members to also submit the anticipated revenue sources which was submitted as follows;

1. **Mbaya Ward:** Charcoal traders who should started paying to the Council and would be a good source of revenue. Also a number of taverns and shops need to be paying trading licenses.
2. **Chivuna ward:** there were a lot of shops which did not pay trading licenses.
3. **Munenga ward:** there was;
 - i. A lot River Sand gotten from Magoye River
 - ii. Bubble fish harvested during a period of fish ban
 - iii. Milk was sold in bulk
 - iv. Tandabale and Munenga Markets had 38 and 12 shops respectively.
 - v. Sellers of village Chickens to start paying certain fee to the Council.
4. **Mwanachingwala ward:** there were a lot of cattle passing through the ward, River sand gotten from Magoye River, there was a Market with 40 shops, a lot of Booths and charcoal traders. All these needed to start paying to the Council.
5. **Munjile ward:** there were shops to be collecting trading licenses.
6. **Ngwezi ward:** They proposed an introduction of levies on; Livestock, Market, Charcoal, and Sand. There were also shops that needed to start paying trading licenses.
7. **Musuma ward:** there were 2 Tower Masks in the area for Airtel and Zamtel network providers. There were also shops around, welders and gravel levy could be introduced.
8. **Nachipoma ward:** there was an Ablution block constructed by the Council, Kaleya Market which had a number of shops, Waste levy could be introduced, firewood levy from the Tracks that brought firewood on daily basis in Kaleya Township. Taverns to start paying trading licenses.

BC/11/09/25:

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- ❖ Members requested Council officials to speed up works on approved projects to avoid unnecessary complaints from the community as well to quickly communicate back on projects that did not take off through the Ward Development Committees. Members further requested Officials from the Local Authority to have time frame for works to be done per individual projects and the Community should be communicated to.
- ❖ The Local Authority discouraged the community on deforestation, the continued cutting down of trees which seriously led to climate change,

instead encouraged the community on Afforestation, planting of more trees.

- ❖ The Group Internal Auditor advised the Ward Development Committee Members to prudently use the funds given to them for the intended purpose to avoid Audit queries. He indicated that his office would once in a while start going round to all the wards to enable them account on all the money previous given to them.

CLOSING REMARKS

The Assistant Public Relations Manager thanked everyone for having attended the Meeting. She said that, communication would be done through the Ward Development Committee Chairpersons on dates the Ordinary Council Meetings would be held as it was important to enable them help disseminate information on approved and not approved project.

There being no any other business to transact, the Meeting was declared closed at 14:35 hours, followed by a prayer given by Mr Hambaba Munangandu, the Church Representative for Nachipoma Ward.
